



Transition & Induction Arrangements

In Blessed Trinity, we are aware that your child's happiness in their new school is of paramount importance. To ensure smooth movement from Primary school to Blessed Trinity, our Transition Team organise the following;

- A teacher from the Transition Team visits each primary school and engages with primary 7 pupils and staff.
- Individualised personal meetings are held for every new Year 8 student with their parent/carer.
- A comprehensive Induction Programme provides new Year 8 students with confidence and clarity about life in Blessed Trinity.

Outline of Care & Support Structure

Each class has a Form Teacher who is a familiar face for them throughout their first year in Blessed Trinity.

The year group has a highly experienced team to look after the care and welfare of our students; they are the Assistant Vice Principal, Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year. The Care Team takes a special interest in the personalised needs of each child, and will become very special in the lives of our Year 8 students. The Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year will be the first point of contact for parents and carers.



Our School Counsellors

Our two School Counsellors highlight the importance of emotional well-being in our school. Our counsellors are familiar faces to our students and provide one-to-one and group support, as required.



Home-School Links

In Blessed Trinity, we aim to build strong relationships between school and home, to support our students. The Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year, meet with parents throughout the year, to support progress and to nurture this vital relationship. Our parents/carers are invited to school performances, celebrations and events throughout the year.

Learning Support Centre

Our Learning Support Centre is designed to support the work carried out in the classroom. It offers another layer of care and support, and indeed is a 'nurture centre' for those students who, at times, may benefit from a quiet space. 




